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EnSave Provides Data Collections Trainings

EnSave has recently provided Data Collector Trainings to qualified applicants in Florida, Maryland, New Hampshire and Vermont. It has also recently hosted an on-line training.

The four trainings were designed to train qualified applicants to collect energy and equipment usage data on farms. Data Collectors are an integral part of EnSave's programs, as the information they collect is used to provide farm energy audits to the farmers they visit.

The trainings in Florida, Maryland and Vermont (which included attendees from nearby New Hampshire) consisted of a half-day of classroom training, four on-site farm visits, and a half-day conclusion and wrap-up. The online training was developed to bring the data collector training to a company's representatives who were spread across the United States. It comprised a 3-hour online course which covered EnSave's needs as well as what the representatives should look for when visiting farms.

The Florida and Vermont trainings were courtesy of Conservation Innovation Grants and an Environmental Protection Agency grant, while the Maryland training was developed to support the Maryland Statewide Farm Energy Audit Program, which EnSave is currently administering. The online training was developed for a private client.
