EnSave Holds Data Collector Training in North Carolina

Richmond, VT, April 28, 2009

EnSave President Steve Faust recently traveled to North Carolina to provide farm energy audit data collector training to area Resource Conservation and Development (RC&D) Councils.

The training was held in collaboration with the North Carolina Farm Bureau. Six people attended the trainings; three from North Carolina and three from South Carolina. All six became certified EnSave Data Collectors.

The EnSave Data Collector Training is a three-day intensive course that combines both classroom time and field experience. Over the course of the training, four area farms are visited. Farms are chosen based on a State's dominant agricultural commodities. In North Carolina, trainees visited two poultry and two dairy operations.

"North Carolina has an amazing opportunity to reduce energy consumption without compromising its production standards," said trainer Steve Faust. Once trained, these data collectors will work with EnSave to provide farm energy audits.

EnSave has provided over 2,000 farm energy audits across the United States. These audits review a farmer's energy and fuel usage and recommend steps a farmer can take to reduce the amount of fuel and energy used without sacrificing productivity.
